Maple Ridge

A five-part pattern *part 4*

Courthouse Steps block

CUTTING

From the dark cream:

16 strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " (D)

16 strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " (C)

16 strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " (B)

From the dark ruby red:

8 squares $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " (A)

From the coral:

16 strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " (C)

From the burgundy:

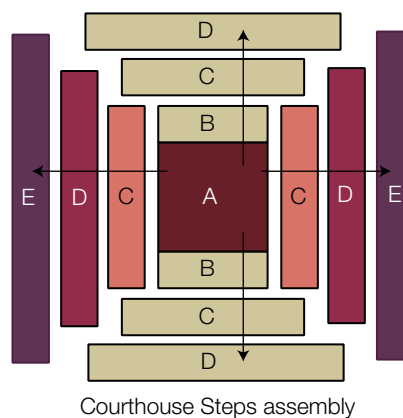
16 strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " (D)

From the dark purple:

16 strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " (E)

Block assembly


Sew a dark cream B strip to the top and bottom of the center dark ruby red A square. Press all seam allowances away from the center. Following the block assembly diagram, add the strips in order: coral C, dark cream C, burgundy D, dark cream D, dark purple E. The block should measure $9\frac{1}{2}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " from raw edge to raw edge. Make 8 blocks.

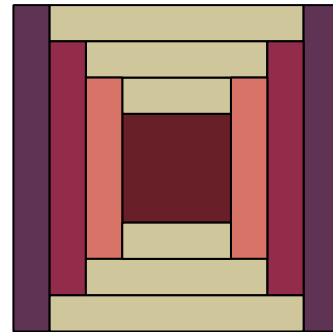


Tip

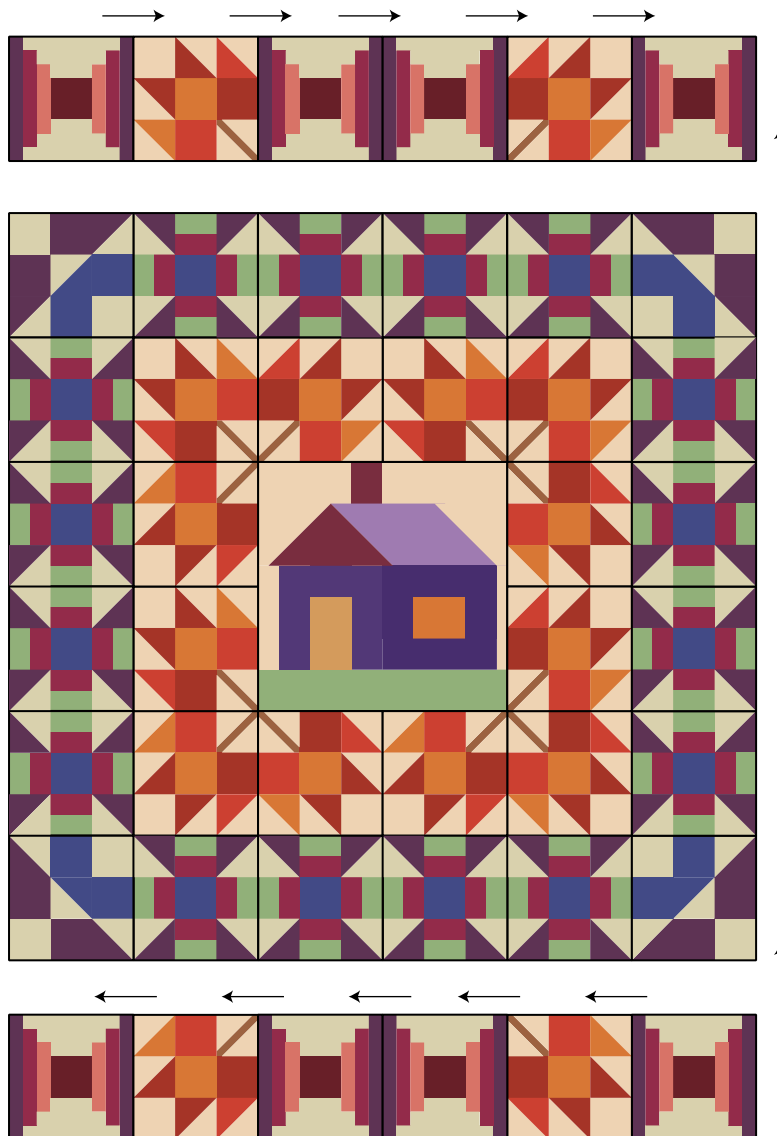
When adding the pieces to the block, stitch with the strip that you are adding on the top.

Adding the border

Referring to the figure for correct block orientation and placement, join 4 Courthouse Steps blocks and 2 Leaf blocks (from part 2) for the top border. Press all seam allowances in the direction of the arrows. Repeat for the bottom border. Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt. 



Courthouse Steps block – Make 8.



Add the Courthouse Steps/Maple Leaf border to quilt.
