Foundation Paper Piecing (aka Paper Piecing) allows for greater accuracy in piecing small or complex shapes and irregular angles. The paper acts as a stabilizer; thus, the fabric is less likely to stretch or distort. There is also no need for precise cutting or pinning.

Our Color Fusion project is certainly complex-looking; however, once broken down into easy, manageable components (with only two seams to stitch per component), it can be assembled quite quickly and easily.

And even better, you probably already have the fabrics needed (except for the background) in your stash!! You will easily be able to make this quilt larger (or smaller) simply by making more blocks. There are quite a few different design/color alternatives that you can incorporate into your quilt as well.

Linda's relaxed teaching style is both entertaining and educational. She has many tips, techniques, and hacks to share, not to mention some rather funny stories about her life. There's sure to be quite a bit of laughter coming out of her classroom.

Kit Available - Required

Kit Fee: \$30

Kit Includes: Full color pattern, foundation paper to complete the quilt, and two re-useable foundation piecing stencils. (No fabric included)

Sew Machine – Required

You're welcome to bring your machine, or sewing machines are available for rent at \$99 for the week, including two empty bobbins to get you started. Please note that rented machines must stay in the classrooms, and friendly on-site support will be available to assist you. Be sure to reserve your machine when you register, and no later than 60 days before the event. If you did not reserve a machine during registration but wish to do so, please contact a Registration Coordinator at 270-898-7903 by July 31, 2026.

Required Supplies

- [Basic Sewing Supplies](#)
- Machine with a new needle (don't forget the cord and foot pedal)
- 1/4" foot on your machine (or know how to move your needle to set a 1/4" seam)
- Neutral color thread on top and in bobbin
- Scissors - paper and fabric
- Rotary cutting supplies - personal size mat, cutter with a new blade
- Small square ruler - Linda uses an Omnigrid 9-1/2" square
- Straight pins
- Small bag for garbage to tape to table & scotch tape
- Marking tool to transfer foundation stencil onto vellum (Pigma Pen, Thin sharpie)
- Batting 60" x 60" (Throw) to pin your completed pieces onto as you complete them
- Spray starch if you are able to bring it

Fabric Requirements

- Background (white) - 2 1/2 yds.
- Color scraps - 5" strips or a layer cake of 10" squares
- Binding - 3/8 yd.

 - Backing (2) cut of 1½ yds. Each
