


MODERN VICTORIAN HUNTER STAR REVIVAL

Welcome to Modern Victorian Hunter Star! It is recommended you read through the instructions to familiarize yourself with the steps before you begin, and of course, that you use your best skills when cutting, sewing, and pressing.

Modern Victorian Hunter Star Revival is a remake of a pattern Michelle Renee made early in her designing days. To this day it is one of her favorites. It is a great Stashbuster and perfect for matching fabric lines or you could elect to go completely scrappy. Select (11) Half Yard prints of similar value or (22) Fat Quarters and use them to create this fantastic version of a Hunter Star quilt where the Background fabric is the star and border. It's a bit of a reverse roles!

Modern Victorian Hunter Star Revival requires Studio 180 Design's Rapid Fire Petite Hunter Star.

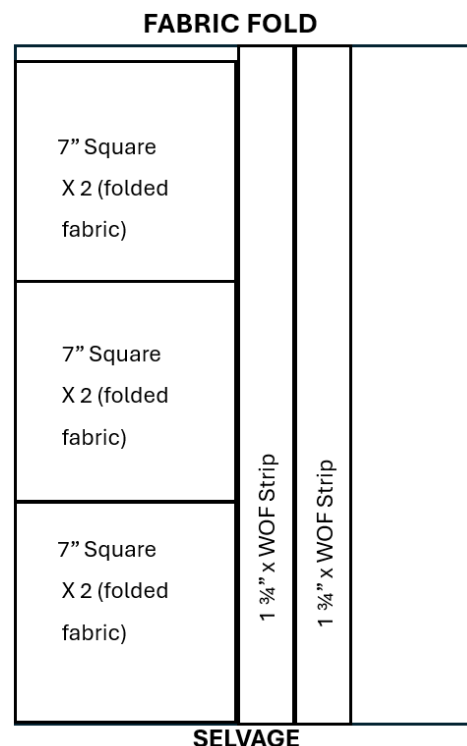
CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS – FOR BLOCKS AND QUILT BORDERS


- WOF = Width of Fabric, cut from selvage to selvage, typically 42" in length.
- HWOFF = Half width of Fabric, cut from selvage to raw edge, typically 21" in length.

RECOMMENDED HALF YARD CUTTING

- Cut (1) 7" x WOF Strip from each Half Yard
 - Sub cut (6) 7" Squares
- Cut (2) 1 3/4" x WOF Strips
- Assign to the proper placement below.

FABRIC CUTTING DIAGRAM

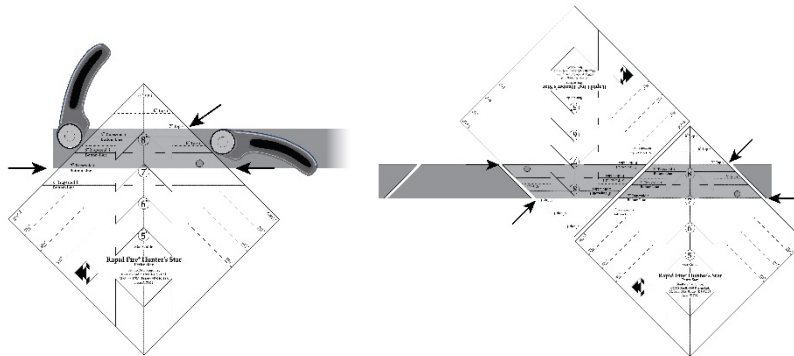


UNIT	PLACEMENT	FABRIC	THROW CUT
Hunter Star 	Triangle	Assorted Half Yards	See Fabric Cutting Diagram on prior page (6) 7" Square from (11) Assorted Half Yard fabrics for a total of (66) 7" Squares <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sub cut in diagonally in half to create (12) Large Half Square Triangle (HST) from each of the Half Yard fabrics. Total of (132) HSTs.
	Trapezoid	Assorted Half Yards	See Fabric Cutting Diagram on prior page (2) 1 3/4" x WOF Strips from (11) Assorted Half Yard fabrics Total of (22) 1 3/4" x WOF Strips
	Diamond	Background	(22) 2 1/4" x WOF Strips
Outer Border	4	Print	Cut and piece: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Side Borders <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (3) 2" x WOF Strips and piece into: *(2) 2" x 56 1/2" Top and Bottom Borders <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (3) 2" x WOF Strips and piece into: *(2) 2" x 59 1/2"
Binding	-	Print/Floral	(7) 2 1/4" x WOF to piece into 255" of Binding

**Remember, the border measurements supplied are estimates. You should measure your quilt in three places in each direction, then average those to determine your border length. This will ensure that your borders fit your quilt top and are not pinched or wavy.*

CUTTING TRAPEZOID/DIAMOND UNITS

- Gather** the (22) 1 3/4" x WOF Assorted Half Yard Fabric Strips. Use the 7" cutting guidelines on the Rapid Fire Petite Hunter's Star tool to cut (6) trapezoids from each of the 1 3/4" strips as shown. You will cut (12) from each of the Half Yard Fabric Strips. Keep your "like" fabric Trapezoids together.
- Lay** the folded strip horizontally on the cutting mat. Work from the selvage end to the fold. If right handed, **lay** a strip with selvages on the right, you will work right to left while cutting. If you are left handed, **lay** the strips with the selvage at the left, you will work left to right while cutting. **Place** the Rapid Fire Petite Hunter Star (RFPHS) "On Point" and **align** the 7" Trapezoid Bottom Line with the bottom edge of the strip. The top of the strip should hit the 7" Top line of the RFPHS. **Cut** on both sides of the ruler.



- Rotate** the RFPHS tool and continue cutting additional trapezoids from the remainder of the strip until you have (6) Trapezoids from that strip. **Repeat** steps 2-3 with each 1 3/4" Strip until you have **(12) Trapezoids from each** of the Half Yard Fabric Strips for a total of (132) Trapezoids. Keep your "like" fabric Trapezoids together.
