In this class, you will learn the basics of how to make a Hawaiian Style quilt using fused appliqué and machine quilting techniques. In the class, you will start with a smaller project where you have the opportunity to design your own Hawaiian-style pattern with guidance from the Karla. You will make a smaller project and focus on finishing appliqué projects by machine. Throughout the day, you will trace, fuse, and cut the larger design.

- (1) 30" square - Batik OR Hand-Dyed fabric, pattern/design of your choice
- (1) 30" square - pre-washed, dried, and ironed fabric contrasting colors (for background)
- (1) 30" square - Soft Fuse Premium OR your preferred fusible (iron fusible to batik fabric before class)
- Matching thread that coordinates or contrasts with background fabric, up to the student
- Pencil for tracing fabric
- Sharp Fabric Scissors
