This block may look intimidating but is actually very simple...there's just a "lot of it." This would be great for a confident beginner to needle-turn appliqué...the shapes are very simple and most of the block is repetition. As the name implies, needle turn appliqué is a method in which the point of the needle is used to turn under raw edges of fabric as they are being sewn down. Students will also learn how to make bias stems, circles, and a laminate overlay. Registration for this class includes show admission for Thursday.

Supplies:

Please bring the following items to class:

- **Basic Sewing Supplies**
- (1) 21" square - light background fabric
- (1) fat quarter (18" x 22") - red fabric for berries
- (3) fat quarters (18" x 22") - green fabric (1 for the 12 large leaves and the stems and 2 others for the greens on opposite sides of the stems)
- Clover bias maker #6 (makes the ¼" strip)
- Needles (sharps and appliqué)
- Mechanical pencil
- Small pair of scissors for clipping and trimming
- Basting thread or Fabric Glue
- Appliqué pins
- Karen Kay Buckley's Perfect Circles (optional but recommended)
- Fine-tipped permanent black marker
- Erasable Markers (light and dark)
- Paper scissors
